Class 1	Mini Clear Round
Class 2	Mini Maiden Stakes (You jump the whole course and if you jump a clear round you stay in and jump a shortened course against the clock.)
Class 3	Mini Ride and Run (Ride the course, then run the first 3 on foot!)
Class 4	Mini Pairs Relay (Pair up with a pal, Rider 1 goes first, followed by Rider 2)
Following straight on from Class 4...

Class 5	Clear Round
Class 6	Maiden Stakes (You jump the whole course and if you jump a clear round you stay in and jump a shortened course against the clock.)
Class 7	Maiden Stakes (60cm) (You jump the whole course and if you jump a clear round you stay in and jump a shortened course against the clock.)
Class 8	Scurry (60cm) Jump the whole course against the clock!
Class 9	Take Your Own Line (Jump every jump taking your own line)
Class 10	TopScore with Joker (Varied heights) (Every jump earns you points...can you max the Joker Jump?...)

Please note that all of our mini classes PERMIT lead reins - this is a fun show, so we want to make it as accessible as possible to everyone.

We do ask that if you are planning to compete in the bigger classes that you don't compete in all of the smaller classes, to make it as fair as possible for everyone.

Heights are approximate and will be determined by the level of riders competing on the day.

The City of Edinburgh Horse Show Terms & Conditions & Rules

1. The Edinburgh March Riding Association Ltd, Show Organisers and Tower Farm Riding Stables accept no responsibility for damage, accident, injury or loss to competitors, their servants, onlookers, horses, vehicles, tack or property in connection with or arising from the show and it shall be a condition of entry that each entrant shall indemnify the Organisers of the City of Edinburgh Horse Show and the owners of the property against any legal action arising from any mishap.
2. Horseboxes and vehicles towing trailers are required to be parked with patience and consideration and to strictly follow the instructions of our stewards. Due to restricted parking, animals may have to remain in their transport vehicles between classes. Antisocial behaviour towards our stewards by competitors or counterparts will not be tolerated and The City of Edinburgh Horse Show reserves the right to have these individuals withdrawn from entries and to ask them to leave. No refunds will be given.
3. In all events the judges decision is final.
4. Any objection must be made in writing with a deposit of £20 (returnable if objection is upheld), within 30 minutes of completion of a class and handed to the Show Secretary.
5. Correct dress must be worn in the arenas and hats with fastened 3 point restraining harness to the correct standard must be worn by any person riding in and around the showground.
6. The organisers reserve the right to combine, amend, split or cancel classes as they see fit and withhold any prizes in the event of insufficient entries.
7. Stallions must be handled by a responsible person over the age of 16.
8. Ponies 14.2hh and under, Horses over 14.2hh.
9. No monies will be refunded for competitors unable to compete due to classes running consecutively, overlapping or if a competitor enters the wrong class. Monies may be transferred to other classes at the Secretary's discretion. No entry fee will be refunded, except on production of medical or veterinary certificate within 7 days, less £3 administration fee.
10. The judges reserve the right to disqualify any rider, horse or pony found to be entered in an event for which they are not eligible, or to eliminate an unsound or unfit horse/pony from the competition.
11. Any person ill-treating a horse or pony will be asked to leave.
12. A compulsory fee of £2 per rider/handler must be paid for First Aid cover. No competitor will be permitted to take part in the show if this fee has not been paid. No refunds will be given.
13. Horses can easily be frightened and can become dangerous. Members of the public are requested to keep clear from horse areas/lanes and to refrain from behaviour that may alarm horses.
14. Dogs are not permitted at the show and can not be left in parked vehicles. Young children must be kept under close supervision and control of an adult.
15. No galloping on the showground.

The Edinburgh Riding of the Marches is a spectacular and uniquely Scottish event, culminating in a cavalcade of 280 horses riding up the historic Royal Mile. Accompanied by pipe bands and led by the Lord Provost of Edinburgh, City Officer, The High Constables, The Deacon Convenor of the Incorporated Trades of Edinburgh, Trades Officer, The Old Master and Lord Dean of Guild of the Merchants Company of Edinburgh and the Edinburgh Exiles Society, carrying their associated banners and flags, watched by crowds in excess of 20,000 people lining the cobbled streets.

The symbolic tradition of inspecting the common land dates back centuries, to at least 1494, making it one of the oldest rides in Scotland. The first record of a Riding of the Marches in Edinburgh was on All Hallows (Halloween), 31st October 1579.

On this date, a group of townspeople gathered at the Provost's house at 11 o'clock, from where they embarked on an inspection of the Marches of the Common Land led by the Captain of the Trained Band (Town Guard), the Lord Provost, Bailies and Burgesses. The inspection of the Common Land continued, until the demise of the practice in 1718.



In 1946 a special 'Riding of the Marches' was held in Edinburgh to celebrate peace and the end of the war. Seventy riders took part and a large crowd, reported to be 'approaching Royal visit dimensions' greeted the riders on the Royal Mile.

The modern day re-enactment, revived in 2009, also commemorates Randolph Murray's return to Edinburgh with the ancient Blue Blanket and the tragic news of the defeat of the Scottish Army at the Battle of Flodden 1513 and is in honour of those who sought to protect the integrity of Edinburgh's Common Land and defend the inhabitants of the city.



All are welcome to watch the event. Entertainment starts on the Royal Mile at 1230hrs and the cavalcade of horses arrives at Holyrood Palace at 1535hrs, making its way up to the Mercat Cross for 1555hrs.

This event is FREE to watch.
